WHY CONSTRUCTION??







Largest single industrial employer in the EU 15 million workers in EU 28

90% Male 10% Female 13,5 million 1,5 million

2013 Eurostat figures - Not always high reliability on female data

Not a sector for young people





92% of the workers older than 25

8% of the workers are YOUNG 1,3 million workers younger than 25

10% of all young workers are female 80% of female between 25 and 54 Young female = less than 1% of the working population <u>POSITIVE EVOLUTION?</u>



A sector of small companies



40% of workers in companies with less than 20 workers 50% of workers in companies with less than 50 workers

65% of young workers in small companies 60% of female in companies with less than 50 workers 60% of female in specialised trades & finishing works



Some national examples



UNITED KINGDOM

2,1 million workers

10% young workers = slightly above EU average Higher female participation than EU average = 12% All female workers in the 25y - 55y group = no young females

FRANCE

1,8 million workers

Higher percentage of young workers than EU average – 11% Higher percentage of female workers – 14% BUT lower percentage of young female workers – 5% of all youth



Some national examples



ITALY

1,5 million workers

Low participation of youth and female working population: 7% All young workers in companies with less than 50 workers Problems with reliability of statistics

SPAIN

1 million workers

10% of female workers - EU average Very low youth participation in working population – 2% **No data on young female workers for 2012 nor 2013! Reliability**



Some national examples



GERMANY

2,7 million workers

Higher percentage of young workers than EU average – 11% 75% of young workers in small companies – higher than EU Higher participation of female workers than EU average BUT young women are below the 10% EU average

AUSTRIA

High percentage of young workers – 19% Also high percentage of female workers = 15% No available data on young women

POLAND

1,2 million workers

370k workers

Low participation of young workers = 7,5% Lower participation than average of females to workforce = 6,5%
